Assignment due Tuesday Dec 10:	<p>Project Homework:</p> <p>READ AND FOLLOW THESE DIRECTIONS CAREFULLY! *See back of page for inspiration.</p> <p>PART 1:</p> <p>1.) *Take the grocery bag home I gave you to complete this week's assignment sheet.</p> <p>2.) Take a couple large pages of newspaper and set them aside for later. (DO NOT RIP THESE ONES UP!!)</p> <p>3.) Take the rest of the newspaper in your groc bag and make strips of paper (1" thick) and put them back in the bag. Do this while you watch a show, eat dinner, or whatever. Just make the strips!</p> <p>PART 2: DO THIS BY FRIDAY, SO IT CAN DRY OVER THE WEEKEND.</p> <p><u>(You will need: aluminum foil, cardboard, flour, salt, newspaper...)</u></p> <p>1.) Use the newspaper you didn't tear up and lay them out on a table to catch drips/spills.</p> <p>2.) Get a cookie sheet and aluminum foil. Tear off strips of aluminum foil and make #5 ornament shapes. Be creative. <u>Do not compress the foil too much, it doesn't need to be too dense, it just has to hold shape, and this way you won't need to use as much because you might get in trouble for using up all the aluminum foil...)</u> For flat or more precise shapes, use cut up pieces of cardboard to create your form.</p> <p>3.) Mix 2 cups water, one cup flour and 1 tsp salt in a bowl.</p> <p>4.) One at a time, dip your strips in the paste and as you pull it out, run two fingers down the paper to remove the excess paste. (You don't want it to be too gooey or messy, and <u>you want it to dry fast!!</u>) *Do not put the strips in all at once!</p> <p>5.) Place your paper mache ornaments on the cookie sheet with wax paper to dry over the weekend.</p> <p>6.) Clean up your mess... 😊</p> <p>PART 3:</p> <p>1.) Bring your dried ornaments in your bag with your leftover strips of newspaper to class. We will continue this paper mache in class. We will be painting and stringing them in class.</p>
