Assignment due Tuesday Oct 29:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Portrait Drawing. A face-grid method for portraits.</u> • <u>Find a face in a magazine, book, or catalog around the house and use the proportions guide to help you draw their face into your sketchbook. The face should be straight on. (Your best bet is a haircut magazine from the salon or your parents' old yearbook photo!)</u> • First begin with outlining the shape of the head. • Then draw a light guide-line in the middle to find the placement and size of the shape of the eyes. Draw the shape of the eyes and press lightly, so you can easily erase your lines, and redraw them as needed to readjust the shape of the eye as you work on it and study the size/shape, and correct proportion related to other shapes around it. • Each eye is exactly one eye-width apart. • Use the proportions guide to line up the facial features in the correct spots, for example, the eyes are in the middle of the head, the bottom of the nose is the middle line between the eyes and chin, the lips perfectly between the chin and nostril line. The proportions guide will help you keep your shapes proportionate in relation to one another, helping you create a more realistic portrait.
